## Park Vista Roundabout Design questioned

At the southern end of Kinsellas Road West, residents are questioning the design of the main entry round-about into Park Vista. (Ref: email from Vic Doherty on Page 5)

With the cement kerbing now in place, there are growing calls for an explanation on how the design (shape) of the round-about will affect southbound traffic flows/exit along Kinsellas Road West and how larger vehicles will negotiate the round-about. The primary concern is that all traffic exiting the village, especially large vehicles (buses, trucks etc) will find the turn too restrictive.

When asked, CB Constructions Manager, Trevor Mudge stated that *"the round-about has been built to the designs required by the Moreton Bay Regional Council"*.



The Mango Hill Progress Association has now written to Moreton Bay Regional Council to seek an on-site review of the design before the final implementation of the road-works.

## REVIEW OF ENTRY TO PARK VISTA (North) SOUGHT

The Mango Hill Progress Association has written to Moreton Bay Regional Council to seek an urgent review of the sighting of the northern entry into Park Vista given the flooding of last week where water covered the Kinsellas Road West/Mary St East corner to approximately 400mm. (Flooding of this corner has occurred 3 times since 2009)



Maps circulated by Villaworld in December 2011 indicate that a roundabout will be constructed on this spot despite earlier maps showing an entry some 40 metres up the hill and entering onto Kinsellas Road West halfway between Mary St East and Rose St East.

The Association has requested that Moreton Bay Regional Council review and respond to us on the sighting of this roundabout given that with full development, residents from 300-400 dwellings would use this junction for access to Kinsellas Road West.

With the Park Vista housing settlement rapidly taking place and the imminent arrival of our new neighbours, it is a good time to say Welcome.

From its early years, the Mango Hill Progress Association was well aware of the potential for rapid expansion of residential developments in this part of the Moreton Bay Regional Council (then Pine Rivers Shire Council).

In the 1980s and 1990s, the Association sought a balanced approach to development through quite successful negotiations with the Pine Rivers Shire, examples of which included the establishment of the existing Green Belt around the Village and the retention of Lake Halpine in the south of Mango Hill.

We acknowledge that Local Government must work under the State Governments South East Qld Strategic Plan (est: 2004) which seeks to *"manage growth and protect the region's lifestyle and environment"* (as stated on the [Local Government Website](#)) and which calls for a density of housing far greater in those early years.

It is history that the Association sought a better deal for both the environment and residents in general when it lost the argument for the retention of the Green belt along Kinsellas Road West. Yes, we must move on, but Councils need to ensure there must be a balance between developments and retention of the environment.

We do welcome all new residents and hope that they will see themselves as residents of the Village and that they participate in the activities of the Mango Hill Progress Association.

However, it is vital that we remain vigilant and that we continue to address issues that are important to residents, both present and future in the Mango Hill and North Lakes community.


## 250mm on Tuesday Night and Drains fill up in Village Drenching



*No one was hurt, but it does not pay to drive into water.*

With falls of 230-240mm on Tuesday night (24<sup>th</sup> Jan), it was a very anxious night for some new arrivals in Rose Street as they watched with some concern the water levels rise in the large concrete drain beside their houses.

Despite water reaching its highest level since the drain was constructed back in 1985, the only issues were “downstream” in Mary St East and over Danzy Buchanan Park which regularly goes under in this level of rain.



However the rains did return early on Friday morning as most Villagers slept. New Rose St resident, Yvonne Webster was awoken at 3.00am with the George St drain

rising fast and this time as a raging torrent. Thankfully, the levels did not come as high but were more intense & much faster. *(See insert above as a 450mm rock was washed 500m downstream from John Street.)*

## Moreton Bay Regional Council's Road Program Success.



### Drainage improved for John and May Street Houses

On the positive side, the rains last week did confirmed the great work of Moreton Bay Regional Council Officers in upgrading John St in 2010-2011.

This program is now fulfilling both its road functions as well as carrying and directing underground drainage. A review of a number of backyards on Tuesday night revealed only overhead water flow and not the previous serious inflows from further up the hill and west of John Street. Whilst this is not a total solution, residents are now more confident that their houses will be safer and they look forward to when Alice, May and Rose St West are upgraded to the level where they have both underground drainage as well as kerb and channelling.

**A**t a community meeting in November (article in November issues of Mango Hill News), Moreton Bay Regional Council accepted a number of recommendations from local residents.

**O**ne excellent decision made was to retain a large gum tree in the middle of the park, (planted by Gail Christie in 1986) which had been destined to be removed but will now be retained in a major park improvement program to commence in mid February. (subject to weather)

**T**hankfully, reason prevailed and Russell Bremner of Mary St West was delighted to snap this large bull Koala on 9<sup>th</sup> January and present it to Gail as a tangible outcome of her advocacy for the Tree.

**Note:** With the loss of habitat, **EVERY GUM TREE** is needed to give our Koalas a chance of survival. Individual landowners can make a difference (see article by Alex Collins on Page 7).

# Retaining Trees suitable for Koalas

In Mango Hill most of us have enjoyed a diverse range of plants and animals for many years. With the recent developments, the removal of some of our long cherished trees has placed extra pressure on many of these plants and animals.

Eucalyptus trees are the dominant canopy species in most of Australia. They support many different plants and animals by stabilizing the environment and providing food and shelter. The Koala is one such animal which depends largely on these trees, and unfortunately less trees means less koalas. Some very observant people may have noticed an increase in koala sightings in recent times; unfortunately this does not reflect an increase in population but rather a lack of suitable habitat.

We can all do our bit to try and save these furry Aussies by:

- (1) Planting koala food trees on your property
- (2) Keep dogs chained up at night
- (3) Consider koala friendly fencing (wood for koala access)  
(steel panel for exclusion)
- (4) Drive carefully especially at night
- (5) Consider a habitat garden rather than a commercial one.

A great tree species for this area which grows to an average height of 20 meters, is the scribbly gum *Eucalyptus racemosa*, a popular food tree for koalas. This beautiful tree can be seen on the corner of Kinsellas Rd West and Hamilton Rd, just look for scribbles on the trunk. Care should be taken when choosing a suitable location for eucalypt trees.
