## STATE GOVERNMENT ISSUES TAKEN UP WITH LOCAL MEMBER

With the new State Member now halfway through his first term as the People's Representative for Murrumba, the Association continues to flag issues and follow up on those already put before our State member. At a meeting with Reg earlier this month, Association President raised the following issues.

Already Flagged issues:

### PUBLIC TRANSPORT

1. Follow up with our previous representations to the A/Minister – Steve Minniken re maximising the current routes 681 & 682 through Mango Hill to pick up passengers.
2. Seeking for Bus Routes 680, 681 and 682 to drop off passengers at the town centre in North Lakes rather than the bus station – many older and those with disabilities are disadvantaged
3. The Status of the T2 lane from Kippa-Ring to Rothwell. What is occurring? - is there a likely change?
4. Our recommendations for the extension of the 3<sup>rd</sup> lane along Anzac Ave from Rothwell to Kippa-Ring in both directions, but particularly at the Rothwell end.
5. Upgrade (maintenance) of the lane on Anzac Ave from North Lakes Drive down to the Bruce - (requires better sealing of bitumen - as previously discussed)
6. Increasing signage on both the Bruce Highway and Anzac Ave to reflect Mango Hill.



### New Issues:

- Installing a Public Phone at the New Bus Station in North Lakes – would assist folk using the bus station (particularly those with no mobile phones)
- Discussion on the modification of Routes for 681, 682 via the Mango Hill Village with the construction of the Park Vista Estate within the Mango Hill Village



- Bus Stops for this route
- Consideration of the new Capstone Community
- Invitation to Moreton Bay Rail Link Team to update the community on various planning issues, including Public Transport



Reg has indicated he will come to our November meeting (20<sup>th</sup> Nov) and give responses where possible to the issues raised with him.



### A LITTLE HISTORY OF THE BUCHANAN FAMILY

Lil and her husband Danzy, (along with Walter, Mary and son Philip Buchanan) purchased their farming property on Kinsellas road West, Mango Hill 43 years ago from the Josey family, another local family. They lived on their farm in Deception Bay, until building their home at Mango Hill in 1985. Sadly, Danzy passed away only about 18 months later, but Lil has now been living in the Mango Hill area for 28 years. The Park at the end of Kinsellas Road West was named after Danzy Buchanan in 1987 at the recommendation of the Mango Hill Progress Association in only its 2<sup>nd</sup> year of operation.

'Danzy and Lil Buchanan created a few 'fireworks' of their own, producing a beautiful Roman Candle (daughter) and two Big Bangers (sons). This in turn produced 8 Catherine Wheels (grandchildren) and 17 Tuppenny Bungers (great grandchildren) so far - no Tom Thumbs yet:)

Lil is not very tall, but she is dynamic woman just the same who, along with her husband, has produced a wonderful Christian Heritage. Some of her family call it the Danzy Buchanan Christian Heritage. She is Blessed to be surrounded by many family members, having her son living next door, and four of her grandchildren and their families living in the new Park Vista Estate (which was the original farm).

The great grandchildren call her 'Grandma Lil' which is often changed to 'Grandma Little' - as that is what one of them thought she was called.

What an exciting night was had by all at Grandma Lil's 90th birthday party. I'm sure many of you saw, if not heard, the fireworks booming out the celebration.
