## NBN Schedule to include Mango Hill & North Lakes

### Work to commence in July 2016

On Friday, 16th October, NBN Co issued its full construction schedule for the latest program of rolling out of the NBN across Australia. This schedule will now include Mango Hill and North Lakes with Federal Member Luke Howarth indicating that work will begin in July 2016, although no specific details on which areas of the region will be done first or what order.



When back on 12th March, the then Communication's Minister, Malcom Turnbull visited Mango Hill, the Progress Association advocated strongly that the delivery of the NBN was one of the priority issues for this region for business and social needs of the community. Perhaps we made a good point?

## Progress Association Meets with Main Roads Minister



Last Thursday, (15<sup>th</sup>Oct), along with Rothwell Resident, Aaron Wrench, Mark Kelly and Laurence Christie met with Main Roads Minister, Mark Bailey and Officers of his Department, to push for urgent upgrade to the current Rothwell Roundabout. This meeting was facilitated by State Member for Murrumba, Chris Whiting.

**Summary:** Whilst there remains debate between the State and Federal Governments on the budget available for this project, (hence the form of any upgrade), Minister Bailey stated that it is the intention of his Government to upgrade this intersection in line with the finalization of the Moreton Bay Rail Link. ### "MANGO HILL" NAME FOR ON THE BRUCE?



### PRESS RELEASE FROM FEDERAL MEMBER:

Superfast broadband is coming to more than 5,000 homes and businesses throughout North Lakes, Mango Hill and Griffin under an accelerated three-year rollout of the National Broadband Network (NBN). Last Friday NBN released its full construction schedule, providing Australians with the greatest detail yet on when the NBN will reach them. As your Federal Member of Parliament, I have been lobbying for an NBN rollout in Mango Hill and North Lakes since I was elected and was thrilled to see North Lakes, Mango Hill and Griffin on the list, with construction in these suburbs due to begin by July 2016.

"I've made sure the Minister for Communication understands that internet access is important for our community. It will transform education, health care and other critical online services. Nationwide, more than 1.3 million homes and businesses can now order an NBN service and there are almost 700,000 homes and business under construction. Around 600,000 premises already have an active connection and are enjoying the benefits of very fast broadband. NBN is working to provide fast internet to every home and business in Australia by 2020."

## Lamington Road Connection to Anzac Ave on Track for 2016-2017



### Capestone Boulevard, Mango Hill (Ref:1824046)

Following an article in the Mango Hill News of October, 2014, the Progress Association has sought further updates on the proposed linking of Lamington Road to Anzac Ave opposite the entrance into Capestone Boulevard. In response, Adrian Vincenzi (Technical Officer with Moreton Bay Regional Council) has confirmed that:

***"Moreton Bay Regional Council is progressing the design of this important road link which is programmed for construction in 2016/17."***

Noting that Mango Hill has two stations, (Mango Hill and Mango Hill East – in Capestone), it is anticipated that this link will coincide with, or shortly after the opening of the Moreton Bay Rail Link which is expected to open in late 2016 and which will form part of the proposed **"Ring Road Connection"** (Memorial Drive, Halpine Ave, Mango Hill Boulevard, Capestone Boulevard back to Lamington Road.)

# Community Groups Meet with Minister on Rothwell Roundabout

On Thursday, 15<sup>th</sup> October, *Laurence Christie and Mark Kelly* from the Mango Hill Progress Association and *Aaron Wrench* a representative of the Rothwell Community Reference Group (RCRG), met with the State Minister for Main Roads, Road Safety and Ports, *Mark Bailey MP*, and State member for Murrumba *Chris Whiting at Parliament House*. **Aim:** To outline the concerns of local residents in Rothwell and Mango Hill of the need for “Long Term Planning” for traffic in the vicinity of the Rothwell Roundabout, given the imminent completion of the Moreton Bay Rail Link.



- The RCRG position in respect to the access roads to the new Rothwell rail station, (both Gynther Road and across Saltwater Creek) is that Main Road’s own traffic modelling indicates failure to handle traffic within 5 to 10 years due to issues with the roundabout. Following this discovery, the RCRG organised a petition for the upgrade of the roundabout obtaining approximately 2300 signatures to secure funding. Another concern raised with the Minister is the inevitable flooding of the access road across Saltwater Creek.
- The Mango Hill Progress Association position is that, as well as the upgrade of the roundabout, 3 lanes (each way) needed to be available for the **full length of Anzac Avenue between the roundabout at Rothwell and Klingner Road at Kippa Ring**. Significant traffic bottlenecks occur at each end of this road as it transitions down to only two lanes. Unless this is also addressed then there won’t be an effective solution to the existing and future traffic issues in the vicinity of the roundabout.

**Funding:** Main Roads Officers advised that the option for a Traffic Signals solution would cost in the vicinity of \$36m, funding for which the Department is still yet to secure. (A proposal for a “flyover” would be in the vicinity of \$100m and was unrealistic at this time.)

The Minister confirmed that negotiations with the Federal Government on securing funding was an ongoing issue, although in recent weeks, the State and Federal Governments were closer to achieving agreement although not on what he considered was the agreed 60/30/10 arrangements between the Federal, State and Moreton Bay Regional Council Governments.

**Commitment:**

*The Minister acknowledged that the roundabout upgrade was an important issue and it was a priority to solve. It was the intention of his Government to upgrade this intersection in line with the finalization of the Moreton Bay Rail Link.*

## Minister Urged to return "Mango Hill" to the Bruce




When in 2006, North Lakes became a suburb in its own right, the name of *Mango Hill* was removed from all signs on the Bruce Highway and replaced with North Lakes.

Whilst it is accepted that North Lakes was the "new" predominant commercial location and despite a "partial win" in 2009 when one sign each, Northbound and Southbound being added at a distance of 2km from Anzac Ave, , the removal of Mango Hill has remained a "sore point" for many Mango Hill Residents.

At our meeting with Minister Mark Bailey on 16 October (see page 1), the Progress Association has further submitted that *Mango Hill* be returned to the Bruce, given the following.

- Motorists missing the current ramp exits may travel up to 7km to the next available exit. (safety concerns)
- In the past 5 years, Mango Hill itself has grown enormously, with a new shopping centre (Mango Hill Market Place) and a growing commercial strip along Anzac Ave.
- With the imminent start of the Moreton Bay Rail Link in 2016, Mango Hill will not only have a vastly increased volume of housing, it will also host two new Rail Stations, Mango Hill and Mango Hill East.
- This will see a great many more motorists looking for Mango Hill as they travel the Bruce!

The Progress Association has submitted that "Mango Hill" be added to two signs northbound and southbound to alert motorists to the correct exits in reasonable time to make decisions to exit the Highway and prevent unsafe incidents.

The above map is an approximation of the desired location for signage.

Whilst, it is accepted that traffic signs are installed subject to Australia wide "warrants", they should at all times provide motorists with effective information to allow them to make safe and timely decisions.

# Terry & Janice Return Home to UK (but love it here in Mango Hill)



When Janice and Terry Owen arrived in Mango Hill Village from the UK in early 2012, it was not long before they were volunteering their services and making friends with neighbours and members of the Mango Hill Progress Association. It is sad for all of us, that due to health circumstances, Terry and Janice Owen are returning to the UK later this week after three (3) years living in Mango Hill Village.

**The War Years:** Janice were born in November 1942 in the midlands (City of Coventry) whilst Terry was born in 1935 in the nearby industrial city of Birmingham. For those who may not be aware, Coventry bore the brunt of one of the fiercest bombing raids of WW2 when on 14th November, 1940, over 400 German bombers attacked the city, destroying its famous Cathedral and killing 568 residents with many 100s wounded. In the midst of this war and the difficult years that followed, both Terry and Janice grew to adulthood, but were destined to spend their lives together. (This is their story)



**Terry Owen:** Terry was a young boy during the dark years of WW2, only escaping military service due to his age but saw many things that thankfully children of today are spared. In the 1950's, after leaving school Terry became an apprentice compositor in the Printing Industry, working on magazines. In 1956 he was called up for National Service and served as a Medical Orderly in the RMAC (Royal Medical Army Corp) in post war Germany for 2 years. On leaving the Army, Terry returned to the Newspaper industry which he loved. Like so many other industries, due to technology the Newspaper industry began to shrink resulting in Terry once again taking up work in the medical field in the National Health Service in the UK.

**Janice Owen:** For me, I was born less than two years after the terrible bombing of Coventry. They were difficult years. However, we survived. I attended The Underwood Secretarial College after leaving school where I graduated with Shorthand and Typing qualifications and later in life I was to join the National Health Service, where I worked in the Pathology Department for many years, a role I thoroughly enjoyed.

**Life Together:** Laurence tells me that you once had "Cloudland" in Brisbane where young couples met. Sadly it is now gone! For us in Coventry in the Post War years, it was the "**Locarno Dance Hall**". In the early 1960's, *Gerry and the Pacemakers* beating up the charts and the *Beatles* were about to launch themselves onto the World Stage. It was the place I met Terry Owen and could he Dance? One year later we were married (on my Mum's birthday) and together over the next few decades we lived and worked in Coventry, Warwick and a few other towns, as we brought up our two children, Gavin and Cherry-ann.

In 1996, Cherry-ann immigrated to Scarborough over in Redcliffe and over the next decade we travelled to Australia on our holidays to visit our daughter. It was not long before, we decided that Australia was also for us and in January 2012, we arrived in Mango Hill Village.

**Arrival in Mango Hill:** From Day 1, we received a warm welcome from Ken Hatchman and Laurence Christie from the local Progress Association who introduced us to the many activities of your community, our first experience being to "pop down to Skate Night for ½ hour for a Sausage on bread". We stayed for the night and this began our very happy involvement with our new community. We made many new friends and loved volunteering our time at Skate Nights and your Christmas Carols nights & enjoying a "Good Cuppa" after the monthly Progress Association meetings with friends. I have also been pleased to help out as a member of the Mango Hill Progress Association Management Committee for the past two years. Sadly due to health circumstances, we must return now to Bournemouth on England's southern coast, but will not forget this community. We hope that the Mango Hill Progress Association will continue for many years to come.
