New Service centre on Anzac Ave to consign Linda's old House to History!


As told in the Mango Hill News of June 2014, this little house on the corner of Anzac Ave and Lighthouse Court (previously Kinsellas Road West) was the family home of Mrs Linda Winfield (1900-1976). Linda was described as a "tough old bird", who worked a small crop farm and then became well known for her "entrepreneurial skills" amongst the local community during WW2. Linda's granddaughter by Law was to live in the Mango Hill Village (proper) for over 20 years until 2016. For the past 40 years,

the property has been largely used for agistment for livestock.

Given the rapid momentum of development, it was no surprise to local residents to hear Councillor Julie Greer outline to our October meeting, that an application for a major retail centre is planned for this property.

Soon the old house will be consigned to history and be replaced by a new retail centre that will house amongst other options, a Service Station, Child Care Centre, Food and Drink Outlet. In addition, there may well be other service Centres, such as Warehouse, Showroom, Health Care Services, Hardware and Trade Supplies as well as Veterinary Services.

An application is currently before Council under *Lot 1 Anzac Avenue, Mango Hill - DA/35004/2017/V24P (Cnr Anzac Avenue/Diamond Jubilee Way/Lighthouse Crt). Just another change to the history of our community.*
